


Our kids need camp!

The family of **Cara Ellen Soules Farquharson**, camper and counsellor approx. 2008 - 2018 have shared this update with Cara's Oconto friends: Cara's Memorial Bench is now installed at the Soules Family Plot at Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Toronto.

So many of you have chosen special ways to honour and remember Cara. For 'Cara's Tree Project', the first was planted by family friends in Cape Town, SA - as they said "with the magnificent Twelve Apostles Mountain forever watching over Cara's conifer" - and as near as Bennington Heights Schoolground, beside the home where Cara grew up. And more trees are planned to be planted. Another friend has produced a music album dedicated to Cara and still another did a 100 km bike ride to raise money for mental health in Cara's name. Camp Oconto is installing a donor pillar in their dining hall, and Cara's name will be there thanks to those of you who generously donated to the campership fund to send a girl to camp. And some of you have made donations to other charities in Cara's name. The 'Cara Ripple' is how it has been described to me. For me, Cara is present everywhere - in the Lily-Of-The-Valley that are all over our property in the spring and the paperwhite moths that accompany the blossoming of their delicate white bells, in the joy of summer camp, in her laughter with the fall of autumn leaves, in the first snow fall, and in the faces and conversations of her maturing friends. It is astonishing and comforting that she is ever present.

Thank you all for honouring Cara in your own way and please feel welcome to visit our Mount Pleasant site and, as the bench welcomes you to, 'sit awhile'.
